Harrietsham Gardening Society

At our February meeting Victoria Golding gave an excellent presentation on the construction and maintenance of a garden wildlife pond. This included the suitable siting of the pond along with the choice

of lining material. She advised on having a shallow area to enable wildlife to enter and leave the pond, plus a deeper area that would not freeze to its complete depth in a harsh winter. Also covered were suitable aquatic and marginal plants plus invasive plants to avoid. She also showed the wildlife likely to be drawn to the pond, for example frogs, newts and dragonflies. This was an excellent, informative talk, giving us a very good approach to encourage a variety of wildlife in to our gardens. The meeting rounded off with tea, coffee and biscuits plus a raffle.

The meeting on the 16 April will include a talk by Caroline Halfpenny titled, 'A Gardener Abroad'.






Harrietsham History Society

WORLD RECORD BREAKING TEAM

The inaugural **World's Toughest Row - Pacific** began on 12 June 2023, with 14 teams participating from around the world.

Pacific Discovery set off from the historic harbour of Monterey, followed the path of many adventurers and explorers of yesteryear, and rowed 2,800 miles to the finish line in Hanalei Bay on the stunning island of Kauai.

Our team spent two years, almost every day, preparing ourselves - mentally and physically - for this monumental feat. We trained, ate, slept, and repeated - rowing, getting to know each other, and pouring over tasks in our master plan spreadsheet!

We rowed non-stop for 34 days: 2 hours on the oars and 2 hours off. We consumed 850,000 calories, and experienced all the adventure threw at us: equipment failures, tough weather patterns and the perils of almost capsizing, but we also had a front seat with a 360' view of 34 sunrises, sunsets and moonbows. An experience that will last a lifetime.

Accessible Well-being Developing Savouring



In the previous article, I began to share about Savouring. This practice fascinates me. Who could have imagined that such a simple practice may have so many benefits? Last time I mentioned how savouring can increase your ability to feel happy in general. But it also increases resilience to life challenges. Every pleasant moment we savour gives us more strength when we face sad or difficult situations, and the formula is simple – the more bright moments we experience, the easier it will be to remember the light when we find ourselves in the dark.

But, as I mentioned before, in our fast-moving world it becomes easy to lose the ability to savour. Fortunately, there is a way how we can train ourselves in this simple and powerful practice.

- **1. Pause.** If you come across something pleasant, allow yourself time to notice it. Often, two or three seconds will be enough.
- **2. Pay attention to details.** Don't take it as a pleasant blur, let it be more distinct.
- 3. Enjoy the moment, if it is worth it! Feel the excitement. Laugh, shout, jump with joy.




- 4. Prolong experience, if you can.
- 5. Use all your senses to the full. Watch, listen, touch, smell or taste. Sharpen your sensory perceptions. Getting in touch with your senses or taking the time to use them more Consciously, flexes our savouring muscles.
- 6. Preserve good memories. Take a mental picture of what you saw. Look around for something to create an association. Take a "souvenir", so later, when you look at it, you may relive the moment again.
- **7. Share.** Allow others to experience it through you. Sharing will root your experience deeper within you.
- **8. Sharpen your susceptibility.** Sometimes, to have a deeper experience you may need to focus only on one direction close your eyes to enjoy better the sound or smell, or ignore other senses, to enjoy visuals.
- **9. Get absorbed in the moment.** Don't "kill" it with thinking. Concentrate on your sensations and emotions they awaken within you.

10. Be grateful for what you experience.

As you practice savouring more consciously, you will discover more steps on how to increase your ability to savour, something that works best for you. Just remember, the main point of savouring is to create a direct link between your senses and your emotions (bypassing intellect) during the positive experience.

A conclusion – Savouring brings more happiness and value to our lives. But here is another important benefit of savouring – it is one of the cornerstones of Mindfulness. More about it next time.

Christian Message

Hallelujah, Christ is risen!

When you read this, it will be somewhere around 1 April, or April Fool's Day when traditionally people play little but, hopefully not, unkind tricks on each other, up to mid-day at least.

More importantly, this year, 1 April will also be Easter Monday so celebration will be in the air, the taste of chocolate eggs may well be on our lips and Spring flowers will be brightening up the village, reminding us about new life and the Good News of Jesus' resurrection. Thoughts of Lent will be becoming a distant memory.

But as I write this, Lent is in full swing, I am half way through a Lent course, last night friends quizzed me about what I might have given up or taken on for the month, and this morning I attended a Lenten Reflection gathering at Canterbury Cathedral.

One of the Lent course exercises was a practice, devised by Ignatius of Loyola in the 16th century, to read a passage from the Bible and then reread it again taking on the character of one of the people in the story. One of the Lenten reflection exercises was Lectio Divina, a practice which began as far back as the 6th Century, where we read a passage and then slowly re-read it again, each time thinking of a poignant word or verse on which we could meditate, ponder and pray, enjoying being in the presence of God.

These are well known methods of helping us to look at, and dig deeper, into a Bible story in order to have a personal encounter with God and discover new insights.

The Easter Day Gospel reading this year is Mark 16 verses 1-8, where we read about the miraculous rising of our Lord from the grave and his appearance to Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, at the tomb, after they found that the stone had been rolled away. It is a beautiful, but well-known passage, which you may have heard about many times before so I would urge you to read it and then read it again, applying one of these techniques. I can't predict what you will experience but pray that it brings you joy and a little nearer to our Lord who sent his only son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ, to free the world from sin and offer us all eternal life.
