

Harrietsham Community Speedwatch

Hopefully all readers will be pleased to see that the Average Speed Cameras have been installed on the Ashford Road.

Or at least they should be as KCC told us that they would be installed on Monday 17th July – were they?



Kent Police have said that while the six-month Average Speed Cameras trial is being carried out, Speedwatch activities must be suspended on the Ashford Road.

Our first session with Alan Watson, Kent Police's Speedwatch Manager, was in October 2020 but we were immediately suspended due to the Second Covid lockdown so didn't really get going until April 2021. Since then, we have had 116 sessions standing by the road side.

Overall in these 116 sessions:

- 24,626 vehicles were counted (vehicles closely following a vehicle in front are ignored)
- 1,548 were driving over 35mph (35mph is the speed when police will prosecute)
- The fastest was driving at 72mph (a stopping distance of over EIGHT bus lengths)
- 127 drivers received either a personal visit or a letter from Kent Police

Community Speedwatch is an educational measure with warning letters sent by the police to registered owners of vehicles caught exceeding the limit. Speedwatch volunteers wear hi-vis jackets and make use of a speed detection device. As a result, it is usually clear to approaching vehicle drivers that their speed is being monitored and, in many cases, this is sufficient for many motorists to slow down – as our volunteers have found. Those who seem to ignore both the volunteers and the speed limit are reported to Kent Police.

We wish the Average Speed Camera trial well. It is sorely needed as recent traffic surveys carried out by the Parish Council have shown that at certain times of the day.

3 out of every 20 drivers travel on the Ashford Road in excess of 40mph.

Finally, I would like to thank the Speedwatch volunteers who have stood by the road to educate the drivers on the Ashford Road that the speed limit is 30mph. They are Andrea, David, John, Judi, Michael, Peter, Phil, Ray and not forgetting Tony Bell, who is sadly no longer with us.

Early indications, based on the pledges on walkers' sponsorship forms are that the Walk will have raised about £21,000 once Gift Aid is included, of which about two thirds will go to CRUK and the rest to causes nominated by the walkers.

Duncan Payne, president of the Weald Rotary Club, said, "This is a great result, and a tribute to the generosity of all our walkers and their sponsors, particularly at a time when many households are facing a cost of living crisis."

Chas Bedford, chairman of the organising committee paid tribute to the small army of volunteers who acted as route marshals, greeted walkers at checkpoints, registered walkers and sponsor forms, and staffed the kitchen – producing 500 ploughman's lunches, strawberries and cream, and hot and cold drinks. "A lot of walkers have praised how friendly and professional our helpers were. I want to thank all of them. I also want to thank Family Funeral Service, our event sponsor, who have underwritten all our expenses, meaning that every penny raised in sponsorship has gone to the charities and not to admin."

Rotary is committed to protecting the environment and, this year, all of the disposable lunchboxes, cups and cutlery were Vegware compostables, and were accepted by KCC for composting. Other waste was separated into categories for recycling, leaving an absolute minimum of 'general waste' going to landfill.

Weald of Kent Rotary have been running the North Downs Walk for 38 years, missing only 2020 due to lockdowns, and plan to continue running it as long as there are walkers. The provisional date for next year is Sunday 9 June.



Christian Message

August is a month when many of us will be taking holidays or else thinking wistfully in my case of a holiday taken earlier. We've had bizarre weather this year, with just so much rain, followed by just so little rain and just so many cold winds, and I imagine we're all hoping for some sun for our holidays.

Of course, all this odd weather is probably related to the global climate crisis. This was particularly obvious last year with country fires. The Christian faith teaches us that God loves the whole world. The most famous verse in the Bible, John 3:16, says (literally) that "God so loved the whole *cosmos*, that He gave His only son" that it would be freed for eternal life. So, it's not just humans that God cares about, and if God cares about the whole world so should we.

The trouble is, we are not very good at it. We need to learn a completely new way of thinking where we don't just care about the cost of things, but the carbon cost of things. In other words how much carbon dioxide equivalents things cost, in their manufacture, and transport and how we use them.

I've been using a book called, "How bad are my bananas?" (by Mike Berners-Lee, a professor at Lancaster Uni) to help educate us in the Len Valley Benefice.

It turns out bananas are quite good to eat, because they are transported by boat, which reduces their carbon footprint. However, eating strawberries that are flown in from abroad is a disaster. Amazingly, the milk in a cup of coffee can make up as much as three quarters of its carbon footprint (much more than the electricity used to boil the kettle) because of the methane production linked to the dairy industry. Going on holiday and staying a night in a hotel can be expensive in terms of carbon footprint, depending on how it does its laundry, overheats (or air-con's) its rooms and what kind of food it uses.

And one long haul flight (say Hong Kong return) is the equivalent of about 25 return trips to Glasgow in a small electric car, or 75 trips if you go business class.

The point here is simply that there's so much that we don't know, and we need to educate ourselves because, remarkably this stuff still isn't taught in schools.

Why bother? So that our children and grandchildren are spared the worst of a world where the climate is against us much, much more than the inconvenience of a bit of rain and cold winds!
