Borough Council Corner

We attended a zoom meeting of other councillors and Parish Councils within the cluster group of Boxley, Detling and Thurnham, Harrietsham and Lenham and North Downs along with the police and Borough Council officers,.

It was very informative, and we learnt of the new Neighbourhood policing being introduced.

The policing team should be fully resourced by end of January. The current beat officers are Task Force officers, and they will be replaced with regular beat officers. Our Beat officer now is PC Troth. Officers being visible has been prioritised. The difference between the previous model and the new model was explained, specifically in relation to the roles of the Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs). Regular Beat officers, have an array of powers that PCSOs cannot use. The PCSOs have been retained, but in different "problem solving" roles.

The Waste Crime Manager Carl McIvor from MBC provided an update on fly tipping within the cluster.

There were discussions around the use of cameras. It was stated that offenders were being prosecuted for failing to manage their waste, and the removal of abandoned vehicles had been progressed.

Additionally, discussion and feedback on speeding vehicles, off road biking and other crimes such as farm thefts and hare coursing. All in all it made us appreciate the efforts being made on behalf of us all with the police and other agencies working together.

Can we also promote Food stations that exist within the community in Harrietsham St John the Baptist Church and of Lenham St Mary's church. We thank both churches, communities and the volunteers for their continued support and assistance. We have been fortunate to receive funding from KCC members grant fund through our representative Shellina Prendergast and local Charitable organisations which exist and whose generous support is so appreciated. Thank you all.

Compared with this, the population of Harrietsham increased by almost 61% from 2113 in 2011 to over 3400 in 2021. An increase of 1287 people.





Lenham W I

This year we look forward every month to more good speakers – Islands of the Medway, Women in Policing, Ghosts, Bumble Bees and Quizzes and Games Nights.

At Federation level we will be going to the Annual General Meeting in March, Lifestyle Days, Craft Workshops and Whist Days. Our AGM is held in Tunbridge Wells and the speakers this year are Dr Annie Gray who is one of the country's leading food historians and Lindsay Barrell (aka Ms Cherry Bombe) talking about "Burlesque, Me and the WI".

Nationally we have the opportunity to vote on one of four resolutions. This year they are:

- Dental Health Matters. The WI calls on the Government to increase investment in the training and retention of dentists and review the inadequate NHS contracts to ensure that everyone can access an NHS dentist. Currently one in four people need dentist treatment but are not able to sign up to an NHS dentist.
- 2. Impacts of Poor Housing Conditions. The WI will ask the UK Government to boost housing standards and regulations, increase funding for renovation and increase the supply of affordable and secure housing. Ten million people in England are living in homes that fall below the minimum standard for housing with over one million on social housing waiting lists. In May 2023 the Renters Reform Bill was introduced which would abolish the Section 21 "no fault" evictions. In July 2023 the Social Housing Act hoped to improve the quality of social housing but at a cost of £18 million to local councils. The WI are asking the Government to provide appropriate funding for this.
- 3. Say "No" to gambling advertising. The WI are calling on the Government, regulators, the NHS, educationalists and gambling charities to work together with them to ban gambling advertising. The problem is widespread with around 400 people per annum attempting suicide; 300,000 individuals are experiencing problems whilst 1.8 million are gambling at elevated levels. Italy and Belgium have already banned gambling advertising so it can be done.
- 4. Improving outcomes for women in the criminal justice system. The WI wants to see cross-government collaboration to deliver the 2018 female offender strategy to reduce the number of women, pregnant women and mothers who have committed non-violent offences from being imprisoned. It is estimated that 17,000 children are affected by maternal imprisonment each year and 600 pregnant women enter prison each year with 50 in prison at any one time.

Every WI member can vote for one of these resolutions and the one with the highest number of votes will be adopted.

This month the WI is launching the WI Learning Hub. The WI was born out of a need to educate women and the Hub will provide a rich variety of learning experiences for members. Courses will be online and many of them will be free of charge. So nationally, county wide and locally the WI provides something for everyone.

Accessible Well-being: Self-love

Not that people think that love is not important. They are starved for it; they watch an endless number of films about happy and unhappy love stories, they listen to hundreds of trashy songs about love — yet hardly anyone thinks that there is anything that needs to be learned about love. - **Erich Fromm (The Art of Loving).**

Love is an interesting and rather confusing topic. The majority of people on this planet will agree that love is the most important thing in our lives. Yet, if to ask people what is love, you would, probably, receive as many different answers as people who gave them. It is a bizarre situation that we understand so little about something so important.

For instance, it is not obvious to people that love is something that separates us from animals. No, I don't mean that animals cannot love. They can, and they do, and their love can be absolutely amazing. But animals don't have the need to love. If an animal will not have someone to love, it won't affect this animal in any negative way. It may even improve chances for its survival. But with humans it is different. We have an intrinsic need to love. Not to be loved, but to love. It is an irrepressible impulse that exists in every one of us, that is often misunderstood. We often perceive it as a need to be loved, but this is a big mistake. Unlike animals, if we do not find where to direct our love, it will affect us. It may cause the development of neuroses, may affect our mental health, and even lead to addiction.

But then, there is another problem. As there is no universal understanding of what love is, even when I understand the importance of loving others, it does not guarantee that I will be able to do it. Not many people know how to love, and the staggering number of broken relationships testifies to that.

We can safely conclude that we need to learn to love. But how? Fortunately there is a simple answer to that. It appeared in the Bible.

'Love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

Mark 12:30-31

This well-known quotation gives us a formula for developing the love within – before we will learn to love others we need to learn to love ourselves.

But how to love yourself? First, we need to realise that loving does not equal pleasing. To love yourself you need to do what is good for you. And what is it? Anything that brings you joy without an undertone of guilt, that is good for your body and your peace of mind, will do.

And here is an exercise you can try, that can set you on your way of self-love.

1. Write for 3 minutes (minimum) about how you can love yourself. Do not bullet-point, write it as narration. Think of different ways you can love yourself, be bold, and be inventive (but practical).

Write non-stop. Do not stop to think. Dream while you are writing.

- 2. Choose something from what you just wrote that you can do now today. Write for 3 minutes about it. Describe how it will make you feel. How it will change the way you see yourself. How it will change your relationship with others. How it will affect you in 1 month's time; 1 year.
- 3. Think a little about what you just wrote. Is it valuable? Will it make you happier? Now write for 3 minutes about what will happen if you WILL NOT DO IT. How it will make you feel? What you will be missing out on? What people around you will miss out on?

Hopefully, this exercise will inspire you to embark on an exciting, though not very easy, journey to self-love and better well-being. The next time we will be talking about specific ways how you can bring more love and joy into your life.

Do you feel powerless in the face of Climate Change?

Before you start reading, please note, I am not an expert in the field. I'm an average citizen just trying to make sense of this crazy world!

Do you feel powerless in the face of Climate Change? Like me, do you do your best to recycle, eat less meat and use the car less but then often wonder: is this making any difference? After some pondering, reading and watching many of the recent Climate Change TV programmes, I've decided that yes, we, the public, can make a difference. And I ask you to join me to be part of the Climate Change solution. What the country (and world) needs right now is hope. Hope must come from action. Whether we like it or not, the climate on earth has changed and is changing. According to the UN, 'To keep global warming to no more than 1.5°C ... emissions need to be reduced by 45% by 2030 and reach net zero by 2050'. At the moment, we're heading towards an average global increase of 2°C or higher. This will have consequences for all our lives - particularly our children and grandchildren.

But it's not too late to reverse this pattern. Did you know that the UK's Climate Change Committee has provided the government with a credible plan to reach its target of Carbon Net Zero by 2050 without hurting the economy? It's all possible. BUT...the government is not quite sticking to this plan, even though they commissioned the research. (They are currently: still giving oil and gas companies huge tax breaks - money which could be invested in green technology; being incredibly slow to encourage onshore wind farms and preside over a housing stock that has some of the worst insulated homes in Europe.) To avoid this crisis, the world needs to come together and keep to its pledge of Carbon Net Zero by 2050. However, you could argue, why does the UK need to bother if other countries aren't? I don't have a detailed answer for this but as compassionate human beings, surely we have to lead by example?

Back to my plea! So, while individuals alone may not be able to make the drastic emission cuts to slow down climate change, it's essential that we take action to raise the importance of this huge issue to businesses and politicians. Ultimately, politicians want our vote and businesses want our custom; if we all demand their true commitment to Net Zero by 2050, then change will have to happen.

So what can we do? A lot! The advice from Imperial College, London is that 'using your voice as a consumer, a customer, a member of the electorate and an active citizen, will lead to changes on a much grander scale.'

- Write to our MPs (see www.moralfibres.co.uk on how to do this) or attend one of their surgeries. Personal emails are more effective than mass petitions. Tell them how important the Climate Change Crisis is to us and that we're concerned the present government is veering away from Net Zero by 2050. If enough of us speak up, they will have to listen. See template letters at www.hftf.org.uk/ template-letters
- Continue to consider our life style choices fly less, use the car less. Continue to reduce what we consume, reuse and repair what we can and recycle. Shop wisely and let businesses know if we are not happy with their policies.

Talk to everyone we know – friends, family, neighbours about climate issues. Christian Message

Blue January. The month when credit card bills start to be repaid. The month when the twinkling lights come down but the weather can be grim. The month when calls to the Samaritans go up.

Well, I hope this isn't you. But if it is you, take heart. Spring inevitably comes and the warmth of summer is on the way. The Bible entreats us to "Cast our anxieties upon him (the Lord) because he cares for you" (1 Peter 5:7). That doesn't mean he will pay off our credit cards, but it does mean that God knows us (Psalm 139) and stands with us. The whole message of Christmas is that God, incredibly, came to us! God is for us. God is on our side. As we align ourselves to His will, God fights for us and is alongside us.

In the church in Boughton Malherbe, we are going to start sessions that are a guided space for reflection, for stillness, for withdrawing (at least for an hour) from everyday conflict, and for rediscovering peace and inner strength. (First Saturday of each month at 2 pm.) Part of the reason is that I have become very aware of how many people are struggling in these post-Covid days with busyness and stress and anxiety. Absolutely everybody who wants to come is welcome to these. You don't need to be a churchgoer. You don't need to come regularly. You don't need to share anything with anybody else.

People seem to assume that meditation is the stuff of Buddhists and so on, but actually there's a massively strong Christian tradition for reflective stillness. The early Christians sometimes went out into the dessert and lived their lives there, sometimes sharing their wisdom with others who came to them. Jesus himself spent 40 days in the wilderness as he started his ministry. And modern neuroscience (look at the work of lain McGilchrist) points to the need for more open and abstract thinking for mental flourishing.

So take heart. Blue January? The sun is on the way! The light of Christ be with you.
