## **Harrietsham Gardening Society**

Members were entertained to a very interesting talk on birds of the Medway Estuary by two volunteers from the RSPB, the well-known Golden Wonders, Messrs Smith and Walker. They showed slides of at least 60 different species to be found along the estuary and



that's not all because many birds predominantly found on-shore were excluded, which just goes to show the wealth of wild birds to be found in our county. The talk included a brief description of each species, its habit and identifying features. A very useful free app is 'Merlin' which can be helpful in identification, in particular it will identify a bird if you hold your phone so it can hear the birdsong, croak etc.

Our January meeting is the postponed talk by Dilogen de Alwis entitled 'In praise of weeds' which should be a bit of a turn-around bearing in mind what most people think of them or try to do to them. This will be followed by our AGM; it is important that as many people try to attend as possible as this is when Officers are elected etc.

Finally, wishing everyone a happy and prosperous New Year and I hope your New Year resolutions to join the Gardening Society in 2025 meet with expectations and are sustained!

## **Holocaust Memorial Day**


This year will see many anniversaries associated with the Second World War, but few will be more poignant or relevant to today than the 27 of January.

For it was on this date, in 1945, that units from the Soviet 60th Army of the Ukrainian Front, arrived at the gates of a massive sprawling camp of barbed wire and huts near the recently liberated Polish city of Cracow. This was Auschwitz-Birkenau.

Here they liberated over 7,000 starving and exhausted prisoners but also discovered over 600 unburied corpses, at a cost of 230 Soviet soldiers killed in the fight against desperate units of the Nazi SS and Wehrmacht.

Since 2001 this date has been marked as Holocaust Memorial Day. With antisemitism on the rise across the World following the terrorist attacks on Israel on 7 October 2023- consequently, it has never been more important to learn the lessons of where prejudice and intolerance will lead us. For Auschwitz was responsible for the murder of not only Jewish people, but also gay people, gypsies, disabled people and anyone considered racially inferior by the Nazis.

Therefore, help mark this important anniversary on 27 January by putting a candle in your window and lighting it at 8pm. This will show we all care and respect each other and hopefully we will all work together to make our World more compassionate and accepting.

## **Accessible Well-being - Flow**



Last time I recommended engaging in a search for personal meaning in life as a way to improve well-being. Today I would like to talk more about how to bring more meaning into our lives. One of the ways to achieve it is by reaching the state of Flow, or getting into a "Zone".

The state of Flow can be achieved when one is preoccupied with something they enjoy or value. Who hasn't had an experience when, while doing something, they lost count of time, and forgot about thirst hunger, or other bodily functions? We all have such experiences from time to time. But there is a way how you can achieve a state of Flow not accidentally, but deliberately.

The state of Flow and how to achieve it is extensively described by psychologist Mihaly Csikszentmihalyi in his numerous works. The essence of his teaching is, that we need, voluntarily, to find a challenge that will stretch us to the limits (but not beyond) of our skills.

Applying this idea to any task you are involved in, will increase your well-being, will boost your self-esteem and self-worth, and will bring meaningful joy to your life. And here is the thing. If to talk about your day job, it might be easy to achieve a state



of Flow if you are doing something that you love. Unfortunately, I believe I won't be wrong to state that the majority of people are not so lucky. Yet, our day job is a place where we spend most of our lives. So, it will be a very sensible idea to put a conscious effort to turn our time at work into something personally meaningful and, be it in retrospect, enjoyable.

So, here is a practical task – If you feel that your job is a boring routine, or, contrary, it is too challenging and keeps you in constant anxiety, talk to your manager/supervisor so you can bring the work challenge to the right level, or find a way to increase/decrease the challenge yourself. Once you find the right balance in your work, you will be hooked.

## **Christian Message**

January. Christmas is over! Are you relieved, or sad? But is it over?

Well, in a way, it's not, because the traditional date to remember the Magi or wise teachers from the East visiting Mary, Joseph and Jesus is 6 January. This is sometimes called an epiphany (a revelation or showing from above) or, in the Orthodox Church, a theophany (a showing from God). The Biblical accounts of the birth of Jesus are anything but ordinary, but the visit of these wise teachers after his birth is remarkable in that it revealed Jesus as, not just another wonderful newborn baby, but as somebody extraordinarily special. Indeed, as the very earliest Christians pondered this moment, they realised that the message was that God had come to them in this otherwise ordinary human baby.

Whatever the scientific explanation, a 'star' shows the wise teachers where to go. To quote some liturgy from the orthodox Church, "Using a great star as its mouth, heaven proclaims the presence on earth of him who has overwhelmingly become poor for our sake".

Gifts are given to Jesus. Frankincense was an expensive perfume associated with worship and proclaims Jesus as a priest. Gold was representative of ultimate wealth, and proclaims Jesus as king. And myrrh, another expensive perfume, used at funerals, proclaims Jesus as the king who will die- for you and for me!

What on earth did Mary make of it all, as these wise dignitaries bowed before her tiny baby in the humble surroundings of a manger- an animal feeder?

And what do we make of it? Now that the twinkle of the Christmas lights fades away and we start our New Year diets to get rid of the goose fat, will we still bow before the tiny baby who was God made human? Will we still wonder at the grace of a God who comes to us to seek us out? Will we bring gifts? What about the greatest gift that we can bring: the gift of lives offered to a God who seeks love as a way of living?
