Parish Council News

Harrietsham's Parish Warden

Residents may recall that, during 2023, Kent County Council began a review of the Community Warden Service. This review reduced the number of Wardens across the whole of Kent from 70 to just 32, with those remaining being placed using a Geographic Allocation Policy. This ensured that the surviving Wardens would be based in the areas most in need.

At the time, the Parish Council requested that as many residents as possible responded to the consultation to try to protect the service which is currently seen in the village but, unfortunately, this was unsuccessful and the updated Warden Service will begin to roll out during June 2024.

The Parish Council was very concerned about the negative impact that this new service would have on the village, as we would lose our own Community Warden, Martin Sherwood, who residents have come to rely on during the 13 years he has been operating jointly in Harrietsham and Lenham.

We are therefore very pleased to announce that the Parish Council has made the decision to employ our own Parish Warden, who will start at the end of May. You will all find his face very familiar, as Martin has made the decision, after many years of service with Kent County Council, to accept this new part-time role (3 days a week) and will be based solely in Harrietsham.

Martin's employment was agreed just before this article was written, so I am unable to include the new mobile number for Martin at this point, but this will be advertised in due course. His email address will be: warden@harrietshamparishcouncil.gov.uk

Residents won't see much of a difference in the service offered, the new Parish Warden will still attend the various clubs, as he does presently, and will still be contactable to discuss any concerns you have on a vast array of topics. Hopefully Martin will now have the opportunity to be out and about in the Community more, so you may see him walking around the village.

I hope you will all join me in welcoming Martin to his new role in Harrietsham, he is an asset to the village which we could not afford to lose!

80th Anniversary of D-Day Big Lunch



Lenham WI

In April we welcomed Henny Shotter with her talk about the Three Women of Boughton Malherbe Manor. The first generations of the Wotton family to settle in Kent acquired their lands through marriage and inheritance rather than purchase. Nicholas Wotton acquired the manor of Boughton Malherbe through his second wife, Margaret. Nicholas died in 1447/8 leaving Margaret and two sons, Nicholas junior and Richard. Nicholas junior died in 1480 and his widow Elizabeth in 1494. Their memorial brass in Boughton church shows them with three sons and seven daughters. His son, Robert Wotton married Anne Belknap. At his death his estates were divided between his sisters Elizabeth Cooke, Mary Danett and Anne Wotton. Robert and Anne's daughter, *Mary* married first into the Guldeford family of Leeds in Kent. His daughter, *Margaret* married Thomas Grey, second Marquess of Dorset, grandson of Elizabeth Woodville and thus a cousin of the King. This marriage elevated the family, or at least Margaret, from the gentry to the nobility and brought them close to the Court and the political intrigues of the mid sixteenth century. Margaret and Thomas' son Henry was the father of Lady Jane Grey.

Having succeeded his father at Boughton Malherbe, Thomas Wotton might also have expected to follow him in a career in government service, perhaps holding an appointment at Calais as both his father and grandfather had done. Thomas died in 1587. There is an alabaster memorial bust to Thomas on the north side of the chancel in Boughton Malherbe church. Four of Thomas's sons - Edward, James, John and Henry were knighted. Sir Henry Wotton (1568–1639) was the ambassador to Venice under James 1st. He is famously known for saying "An ambassador is an honest gentleman sent to lie abroad for the good of his country".

Edward subsequently married Margaret, daughter of Philip, third Baron Wharton. Edward died in 1628 and his heir, Thomas, survived his father by only two years. He had no son; his heirs were his four daughters. The greater part of the Wotton estate, including Boughton Malherbe, passed to the eldest daughter, *Catherine*. She was married to Philip Stanhope, Earl of Chesterfield, and her part of the Wotton estates passed down through the Stanhope family until 1750, when it was sold. So *Mary*, *Margaret* – the most influential woman - and Catherine all kept company with royalty and aristocracy etc many of whom would have, over the centuries, visited Boughton Malherbe Manor.

The horse and his rider He has cast into the depths of the sea

A young Mum was concerned that her little boy did not seem to be enjoying Sunday School. He normally came home seeming quite bored, but one day he came back excited! His mum questioned him as to the change of attitude. The son replied, "Well Mum, our teacher today told us how Moses had saved millions of Israelites who are being pursued by the Egyptian Chariots and led them across the Red Sea without getting their shoes wet.

"Well tell me all about it said his mum!

So, the son began the story.

He told her how Moses had managed to get Pharaoh to let the Israelites go from Egypt. However, a brief time later, Pharaoh changed his mind and set his army in pursuit of them.

As they got nearer to the Red Sea, Moses could see the chariots chasing after them. So, he called up the army and told him to erect a Bailey Bridge across the Red Sea. They did so in double quick time, and so all the Israelites were able to get across in safety.

However, just as they had reached the other side, the Egyptian army began crossing the bridge. Moses quickly called up the Air Force and told them to bomb the bridge. They did so just as his Mum was astounded to hear that his Sunday school teacher told the story that her son had just recounted. When she questioned her son about the story, he told her "Actually Mum, if I told you the story that she told us you would not have believed that either!"

Of course, this version is an adaptation of the true story, but nevertheless it introduces something of great importance to the Hebrew people. It demonstrates the enormous power that God had used to rescue his people. The title of this article would serve as a mantra for the Hebrew nation for many, many centuries to come.

As we have recently celebrated Easter, we have been reminded of an even more powerful demonstration what God can do. When Jesus was crucified on what we celebrate as Good Friday, it was with great power that God raised him from the dead on Easter Sunday. Ephesians chapter 1 v 19 speaks of "...the mighty strength that He exerted when He raised Jesus from the dead".

It shows to us that God is not passive in our history, but continually active. It is because of what Jesus had accomplished; he has made it possible to rescue us from the punishment which we deserve for our sinful lives. This can only become a reality for us when we repent of our sins, as Peter exhorted the people to do in Acts Ch. 2 vv 38 – 39. Repentance is a solemn act which we do before God almighty, and ask him to forgive us for our sins, and make us "Born again." It means therefore that God has given to us the option of eternal life to live with him in heaven.

I was quite saddened to hear a leader a few years ago who gave a different idea as to how we get to him. She said that we should imagine leaving Saint Pancras and then on the Eurostar train, heading for somewhere in Germany. She said that we would not be much aware of our surroundings as we continued our journey, but eventually of course we arrive at the destination. It was her version of how one gets to heaven. This of course is totally and utterly false and contrary to scripture. Becoming a Christian is a conscious act of repentance before God, not something that one drifts into.

June 6, 2024 will mark the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings along the Normandy coast during World War II. In honour of this anniversary, our film for June is **The Great Escaper** (12, 2023), the superb true story of Bernard Jordan. The spell-binding drama is set in June 2014, when Bernard, an 89-year-old Royal Navy veteran was living in a care home in Hove, Sussex with his wife Irene. Having missed the official organised trip to Normandy to attend the 70th anniversary of D-Day, Bernard decides to make his own way there. In this he has the whole-hearted support of his wife who delays his absence being noticed long enough for Bernard to board the ferry. Once in France, he revisits old haunts – together with his memories of World War II. Michael Caine and Glenda Jackson give wonderful performances as Bernard and his wife Irene in this fabulous drama, which also marked the last screen appearances for the two marvellous icons of British film. 1 John 3:1

See the love that the Father has shown us so we are right to be called God's children, which is precisely what we are.

In recent weeks, I have been recovering from surgery and so have spent more time than usual watching daytime television. Perhaps you know the programme that I'm thinking of as I write. It features an auction.

The bidding can be brisk at first, but as the price creeps up maybe only two people are left interested. As they continue to bid against each other, it raises the price a little until one gives up and the other becomes the victor as the auctioneer announces "going, going, gone."

Maybe at a decent price but maybe not as much as the seller had hoped for. And then another item fares even worse and is withdrawn as it fails to reach the reserve price. No-one has valued it enough.

And there are times when we too can feel undervalued and unappreciated. Maybe there are times when we treat others similarly? We are probably all guilty of thinking of ourselves and not valuing others. And, maybe we can more easily spot the worst and not the best in others?

I picked this passage for this month when we are encouraged to think about Father's Day. Of course, we all have had earthly fathers – some good, some not so good – but I encourage us all now to remember our Heavenly Father.
