

# **Harrietsham Gardening Society**

Members enjoyed a talk on bees by Wendy Laffan at our January meeting; not the usual honey bee and hives stuff but all about bumblebees and other wild bees, their habits and benefits to our gardens and the environment. Wendy was a very entertaining and knowledgeable speaker and no snoring was heard during the whole meeting.



Our AGM, the first for two years, took place following our speaker and David Oversby was once again elected Chairman. There were no other changes to the officers and committee. We do desperately need some new faces on the committee, particularly the Show sub-committee which we have temporarily merged with the full committee due to lack of volunteers so please put yourself forward if you can.

In the meantime if like many people your potatoes and tomatoes were devastated with blight last year it's worth trying a few resistant varieties which have been bred over the past few years, tomatoes such as Crimson crush and Cocktail crush; potatoes such as any variety beginning Sarpo, Sarpo Mira is a common one, Setanta and Cara are also widely available. However, as ever disease resistance is a compromise with flavour so you have to make your own judgement. Blight of course only occurs under warm humid conditions i.e. temperatures greater than 10 degrees C and humidity greater than 90% for 11 hours twice in 48 hours! What we'd call a couple of humid muggy days. It's best not to plant too close together to keep air circulating if you can and to avoid over-watering.

On a lighter note our next meeting on 15 March is the Spring Show when members bring along their daffodils and other bulbs, shrubs, pot plants and specimen veg. Do get in touch if you'd like to join in. Annual membership of the Society is a mere £15 per annum for 11 meetings: new members are very welcome and you can learn all sorts of things such as:

# Lenham W I

In January we were treated to a very interesting and informative talk from Andrea Tinkler on behalf of her husband, Joe, who is Team Leader and one of three Community First Responders in this area. The First Responder Service is organised and co-ordinated by SECAM, the South East Coast Ambulance Service. When a 999 call is received asking for an ambulance a request is also sent to the First Responders in the area who can get to the patient quickly and give them a better chance of successful treatment. They spend an average of an hour with each patient and will stay with them until the paramedics arrive.

SECAM covers a wide area of South East England as far as Hampshire and have 400 First Responders in total. All these First Responders are volunteers who are trained by the NHS and spend around 10 hours per week helping patients. In the last two years Joe has worked over 1600 hours helping in a variety of emergency situations. There is an App for the smartphone called GOODSAM which can also be used to alert the nearest First Responder to the emergency. The app also shows the location of the nearest defibrillator.

I am sure that many of us had no idea that this service existed but it is good to know that there are some fantastic people out there ready to help at any time of the day or night.

At our March meeting we have a talk by Maurice Chittenden called "My Life amongst the Great Train Robbers". Looking forward to that one! Some of us are also going to Orpington to take part in an English Paper Piecing Patchwork Workshop.

We would like to welcome you to our WI meetings and if you would like to come along we meet at the Community Centre on the second Thursday of the month at 7.30pm. We will be pleased to see you.



# Harrietsham Community Speedwatch Group

Due to the cold winter weather, we only carried out six one-hour sessions in December and January rather than our usual one-and-a-half hour sessions.



However, in those sessions:

- 1,205 vehicles were counted (note that vehicles in a convoy are ignored)
- 84 were driving over 35mph
- 24 were driving over 40mph

# 7 were driving over 45mph

Unbelievably, we recorded **one driver travelling at 55mph** – 83% over the speed limit. Although this driver had not been seen speeding before, they still received a communication from Kent police. In total, Kent police sent nine letters over this period to drivers caught speeding as a result of Speedwatch activities, including two drivers who had been recorded speeding before.

At the session where the 55mph speeder was discovered, there had been 165 vehicles that went past the Speedwatch operators (excluding convoys). Of these, over 25% had been travelling in such a hurry that if caught by the police, there would have been 45 prosecutions for speeding!

As Community Speedwatch volunteers are highly visible and make use of a speed detection device, it is usually clear to vehicle drivers their speed is being monitored. In fact, some motorists may even mistake the volunteers for police officers! Two months ago we said that 1 in 20 drivers on the A20 Ashford Road travel at over 10% above the speed limit and ignore our presence. This time the figure is more like 1 in 15 drivers! Just how fast do drivers speed along the road when Speedwatch is not present?

It is important for everyone to be aware that motor vehicles are potentially lethal weapons and the faster they travel, the less time you have to react to unforeseen hazards or mistakes from other drivers and the greater the impact any collision may have – making it more likely that someone will be killed or seriously injured, and it could be you!

If you have the odd hour or so to spare occasionally to help reduce speeding and improve road safety in Harrietsham, do come and join Speedwatch.


Some residents may remember that we wrote about our Lovely dog, Dolly, who was able to join our family after being rescued from Bosnia via the charity Fetcher Dog. Her pregnant mum Uli had been rescued from a kill shelter in October 2020 and a few days later gave birth to 10 puppies, 8 female and 2 male. Monies were raised to keep both mum and pups alive and by May 2021 they were ready to leave Bosnia. They had all been named after a Netflix period drama having wonderful names like Penelope, Elouise, Geneviève.

It was not long before all but one of the puppies were adopted in England. In November one puppy, Benedict, was still waiting for a home along with Uli, the mother. We often looked at the Fetcher dog website to see whether they had found their forever homes.

Dolly has a wonderful calm nature and gets on well with children, other dogs, cats and has been visiting the older peoples' clubs to help those attending. We wondered whether her mum would be the same and took the decision to adopt her. She arrived at the end of November and has that same disposition although she is almost twice the size, giving her the name Uli Bear, and looks very different to Dolly dog. Benedict the last of the puppies was also adopted that same week.

We are so lucky to have two beautiful loving dogs and we can't thank those at Fetcher Dog enough.
