The wonderful plants that everybody appreciated can no longer be delivered and last year, collecting them proved costly and a lot of extra work. Also, we are all getting older--a familiar cry, I hear you say!!

However, I am delighted to be able to give good news re. The JPK Project which you have so generously supported all these years.

It is in the final stages of development and only the decorators remain on site. The restaurant is popular and gives excellent training and work experience to the learning disabled in the area of Eastbourne. The eight en-suite bedrooms are fully furnished along with communal living space for lounge, games room, TV kitchen and laundry.

All this has been achieved--at last, without any government aid, although the lottery did help with some of the training elements.

The fantastic achievement has overcome every imaginable hold up, from the first stages of planning to the final inspections. My sister, Jill Parker, has never waivered in her determination to see this through as the Project Co-ordinator, collecting an M.B.E. along the way for her services to people with learning disabilities over the last 48 years.

It is only recently, this year, that she has been forced to use a small bank loan to complete the building. She is determined to pay this loan back as quickly as possible - so the fundraising will never stop!

From the Trustees of the Culpepper Charity

We hope that you will have seen our adverts in this magazine over the last few months. We would especially like to thank the Harrietsham Fish Scheme and its Network editorial team for allowing the advertisements to be placed without charge.

Since the Charity was re-launched in November last year, we have provided a number of grants directly or indirectly to people within Harrietsham for heating, food and other financial needs. We have been surprised by the low number of Grant applications received: less than we had expected. We hope that this is due to the people of Harrietsham not being in need of our financial assistance rather than hesitancy on the part of would-be applicants. However, to date we have not turned down a single application.

If you are having trouble making your income stretch to meet your necessary expenditure, do consider requesting financial help from the Culpepper Charity and ask us for a Grant Application Form. You do not have to be receiving state benefits to receive help from the Charity. Rest assured, every Grant is considered individually by all the Trustees and everything is done anonymously. Only the Trustees know to whom Grants are paid, and our Data Protection policy specifically requires that names of applicants are not publicised in any way.

In addition, with the increased cost of food, it is apparent that a food station is required Harrietsham as some residents are already travelling to Lenham to their food station to obtain necessary supplies. Whilst we fully support the new "End of the Rainbow" Harrietsham food station, it is clear that its current location in the porch of our village church can only be temporary whilst a more permanent site is found. We are looking at an option to provide such a permanent site in Harrietsham. If you wish to register an interest, please do so using the contact information below and we will contact you when we are open.

As a member of the congregation of St John the Baptist Church Harrietsham, Jeanne took on the duty of organising the church cleaning rota for 30 years. She helped in the choir and was a sidesman.

Jeanne joined in with many other village activities: The Gardening Club, Film Club, Family History Group, the Community Association, and in earlier years the Whist Drives and barn dances. She was also a long-standing trustee for the Booth and Baldwin Trust.

Following a serious fall in October 2020 Jeanne moved to a nursing home in Tunbridge Wells to be closer to her daughter Helen making it also easier for Alexandra to visit. She missed Harrietsham hugely and continued to speak of her friends and her life there and the wonderful community spirit.

Jeanne was a very sociable person who loved being in company, having a chat about anything and everything. She was always interested in meeting and talking to people about their work and lives. She was a compassionate, thoughtful, dear loyal friend and dedicated member of Harrietsham village life for fifty-five years.

She was a wise person who will be sorely missed by family and friends. She was a dedicated, loving wife, mother, and grandmother, and was at the heart of her family.

A small family cremation service took place in Tunbridge Wells. A Memorial Service in celebration of Jeanne's life will be held on Saturday 13th May 2023 at St John the Baptist Church Harrietsham. All are warmly welcome to celebrate her life.

Lenham WI

Our speaker in March was Dee Larcombe who told us of her life nursing in India. She was born in 1941 and spent her early years in the Stanley Internment Camp in Hong Kong. The camp was liberated in 1945 and she returned to England in 1948 and was put into care where, at the age of 8 she met her husband to be.

When she was 17 she joined St Johns as she wanted to train as a nurse. The training took three years and out of 800 nurses she came second to top. She wrote to a charity telling them of her interest in working in India. It took two years to arrange everything for her to go and by this time she was pregnant. When her son was four months old they travelled to India taking with them all their belongings in about 20 boxes and trunks. After a long journey by train and boat they arrived. At customs everyone's luggage was being opened and checked so she decided not to feed her son so that he would cry and make a lot noise. Consequently the customs officials waved them through quickly.

After travelling for another three days they arrived at the place where they were to live. They found a flat which was very basic and she had to learn to cook on a coal fire. She became pregnant again with her daughter and the day before giving birth she had to travel 100 miles to a hospital which took three hours on a train with hard seats.



Leprosy was prevalent in India then and leprosy patients lived in a village isolated from everyone else. The hospital in the village at that time was only a hut and her husband designed and built a new hospital specifically for them. It took three years to get the hospital up and running and it is still going 40 years on. The only medicine available was and still is Dapsone which has been used now since the 1960's. It takes two years to cure leprosy. Medicine was not given away but sold so that it was not thrown away as something useless. It was seen to be more important. Her husband made shoes out of old tyres for the patients as they had no feeling in their feet and could not walk around barefoot.

She told us about the time she went Christmas shopping and was stopped by police because of a curfew even though the shops were advertising opening hours at that time. The only present she could find for her daughter was a Family Planning doll which was in the window of a clinic.

When her daughter was tiny she was taken by the Indian women because she was white. The women asked what soap she used as they wanted lighter skins too. She found her daughter in a village some distance away. She was lying on a rug without clothes so that the women could see that she was white all over.

They visited a handicraft fair which took two hours in a minibus to get to. Amongst other things were lots of different animals to see including elephants. One of the elephants decided to go on the rampage and many people were killed. They were lucky, they escaped. She has had a very interesting and colourful life in India and she loved every minute of it. She has been back there a number of times since but not to work.

This month we are holding our AGM. It is nice to think we are increasing our membership and that everyone finds something of interest in the WI. We meet at Lenham Community Centre on the second Thursday of each month at 7.30pm. If you would like to come along you would be very welcome to come as a visitor and join us if you wish. 
