Harrietsham In Bloom

Harrietsham in Bloom (HIB) comprises a group of volunteers who plant and maintain 27 raised planters and 3 flowerbeds in the village for the benefit of the people of Harrietsham and others. We have a committee



of 8 people and a further band of around 10 regular volunteers. Fundraising is done mainly via sponsorship by local businesses and a very popular yearly quiz night which this year was attended by nearly 100 villagers, friends and relatives. Each January we hold a well attended social evening, so all in all the HIB scheme is a very community based project.

This year, to celebrate the coronation of our new King, as well as planting geraniums in all of our raised planters which have had good late summer displays due to the recent rains, we completed a coronation themed design in the two main flowerbeds on the village green. Firstly the beds were extended to make them both 7 feet square and then we made a basic computer design which was printed out. After doing some research into suitable plants we overlaid a grid system onto our design printout, and worked out how many of each plant would be required to construct the overall design. The specialized carpet bedding plants were then ordered, and supplied at the beginning of June by Kernock Park Plants in Cornwall, once the danger of frost had passed. The Geraniums in all our raised planters were supplied locally by Amethyst Nurseries in Lynsted.

When planting the two coronation flower beds we first made a string grid corresponding with that on our paper design, so that we could plant each square foot to replicate the design. Over 2,000 plug plants of 5 different varieties were planted and watered in by 4 HIB members and the string grid was then removed. A volunteer made an explanatory plaque for each flowerbed. One of our members regularly watered the beds from the nearby stream, and in periods of prolonged drought we arranged for a local farmer to water the raised beds and the coronation beds. Once established we used scissors to keep the lettering in shape. We entered the Community Project section of Maidstone In Bloom, run in collaboration with Coolings Nurseries, and were very pleased to win Second Place.

We had a lot of fun organizing this project and hope that it brought pleasure and a sense of belonging to everyone who saw it. Our thanks go to Barbara Leppard, Barbara and Barrie Incledon and Ray Bastone who designed, helped and planted the displays. Thanks also to Barbara Leppard and Ray Bastone who kept them tidy during the summer.



Harrietsham Craft Groups

Over the last few months, the craft groups have been very busy. Craft and Chat have had several different craft sessions which have been well attended and which have included making projects such as silk flower hoops, macrame heart hangings, autumn themed projects such as leaf bowls and candles plus macrame leaves, cardmaking and most recently autumn or Christmas gnomes. At the time of writing our next project will probably be a Halloween themed beaded tealight holder featuring a witch, a haunted house, a pumpkin and a ghost set against a starry Halloween night sky.

Knit, Crochet and Craft have also been really busy working on several projects. Firstly, we did joint charity projects of making items as fundraisers for a local Hedgehog Rescue Centre and items for Premature Babies and Babies Born Sleeping at Pembury Hospital. The items for the babies born sleeping included tiny cribs using ice cream tubs as a base and some villagers kindly donated the empty tubs for these. Our most recent project was an Autumn Random Acts of Kindness (RAK) in which we hid lots of little treasures around the village such as worry worms and autumn related items - crocheted and knitted pumpkins, hedgehogs, leaves, mushrooms, etc. We thought the worry worms would be a good idea at this time of year when many children are starting or changing school/s or moving classes which can make them a bit apprehensive and, indeed, the worry worms proved to be very popular. The RAK went on for several weeks with lots of treasures being hidden on particular days culminating in a grande finale on Saturday 30 September when the greatest amount of items were hidden all over the village and lots of families were seen having fun hunting and chatting to each other. Everyone who found a RAK and posted a photo of what they found on Harrietshamites' Facebook page was entered into a prize draw to win a crocheted pumpkin pot full of sweets. The draw took place at Knit, Crochet and Craft on 2nd October. The winner was the son of Tiffany Crouch-Perry and I am told that the whole family were delighted and that the sweets would be shared and no doubt the pot would be refilled before Halloween! Now that the RAK is over we will be concentrating on adding to the village poppy displays that were created last year.

Following the consultation, the council will submit all duly made comments to the Planning Inspector who will then consider them. All responses will also be made publicly available on the Council's website.

In September, Mim, our speaker from Porchlight asked us what we would put into a black plastic bag if we were about to be evicted. It was food for thought. Across Kent, in 2022 Porchlight took over 27,000 calls, they housed over 560 people and supported over 8500 people. They work closely with other organisations through their Porchlight Open Door strategy to give people a fully supported service to get them back to living a normal life with opportunities for work etc. Lenham WI have a close relationship with this charity and will be collecting gifts for Christmas again this year.

Over 30 years ago, Tom Gifford, newly discharged from prison, was homeless. In a London hostel he met probation officer Anton Wallich-Clifford, founder of the Simon Community for the homeless and quickly became his right-hand man. The homeless faced a bleak choice in those days; night shelters or huge, institutional lodging houses.

In 1970, Tom and his wife Brigid founded the National Cyrenians, a fresh interpretation of the Simon Community ideal. The Cyrenian aim was community living for homeless single people. The houses that Tom helped open were based on that principle, with residents and staff living and working closely together. Tom and Brigid campaigned nationwide for the Cyrenians. The office quickly outgrew the Gifford home, so the organisation was moved to Canterbury, where the Simon Community was based, in 1972 and Tom founded a local Cyrenians branch there by persuading the mayor to provide a "temporary" council-owned house. It still thrives.

In 1980, Brigid committed suicide and Tom's life fell apart. He sold their cottage and toured from Brighton to Aberdeen visiting all the projects for homeless people with which he had been involved - and not as a visiting dignitary, but as a client. At Oxford's Simon House, night workers told the manager of the stay of an "old boy who had claimed to have founded the Cyrenians". By the time they realised he was telling the truth, Tom was back on the road.

At the end of 1981, tour completed, he returned on Christmas Eve to the Whitstable Road house he had set up in Canterbury. He wanted, he told the startled workers, to be taken in as a resident. He stayed there for six years. It was not always a comfortable experience for the staff and it ended when he was asked to leave for breaking the "no drinking rule". He could hardly complain because it was a national rule on which he had insisted.

Tom collaborated with Jeremy Sandford, author of Cathy Come Home and of Edna, The Inebriate Woman; and he was the first Chair of what later became the National Homeless Alliance. His legacy to homeless people is considerable; he gave them new homes in which to live and new ways of living at home.

Christian Message

Showing Mercy

The story of 'The Good Samaritan' (Luke 10:25-37) is one of the best known of all of Jesus' parables. The impact of the parable can be seen in our vocabulary as you may hear someone described as 'a good Samaritan'. Or you may be familiar with the charity 'Samaritans' which provides such excellent support to those who need a listening ear.

In the parable, a man is on a journey when he is attacked, robbed and left for dead. Two different men walk past whom we would expect to help him but they do not. Instead, he is bandaged and cared for by a Samaritan. This would have been a great shock and very provocative to Jesus' listeners who had a long-standing dislike and distrust of those who came from Samaria.

At the beginning of the passage, Jesus affirms that we are to love our neighbour. This parable, then, stems from Jesus being asked about who we are to consider our neighbour. As Jesus concludes the parable, He then poses a question of his own:

"Which of these three do you think was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?"

The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him. "Go and do likewise."


So, in talking about loving our neighbour, Jesus challenges us not just with **who** we ought to love but also **how** we show that love. We are told to show mercy.

We live in a time in which, particularly on social media, it is quick and easy to pass judgement. All of us struggle with the temptation to criticise others and write them off when they fall short of our expectations.

The beauty of the Christian message is that God never wrote us off. Despite our failures and shortcomings, the Bible declares in Lamentations 3:22-23:

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.

What wonderful news that every day we can receive afresh the mercy of God! The exhortation of Jesus is that, as people who have received great mercy, we would express that to 'our neighbour'. Perhaps someone immediately springs to mind that you know you can show mercy to? Inspired by the mercy we can receive from God, let us be those who love our neighbour by showing mercy to those around us.
