Parish Council News

KCC Community Warden Consultation

Kent County Council (KCC) is currently consulting on significant changes to the Community Warden Service in Kent, which the Parish Council believes could substantially affect the support which residents are used to receiving in Harrietsham currently. If the proposals are approved, the service will follow a Geographical Allocation Policy, moving Wardens to the areas with the greatest need. Across the whole of the County, the proposal includes plans to reduce the currently employed 54 Wardens to 32, which will result in the remaining Wardens covering a much larger area than they do now. The services offered currently by each Warden are likely to be reduced quite dramatically.

This consultation closes on the 3 October and we would ask that as many residents as possible complete the questionnaire that has been produced by KCC.

The form can be completed in two ways:

On-line: www.kent.gov.uk/communitywardenreview (or Google: KCC Community Warden review)

Paper form: Please contact the Parish Clerk, any Parish Councillor or our Community Warden, Martin Sherwood, who will be able to give you a paper copy to complete.

If completing the paper form questionnaire, please do not send this back to KCC through the post. Your completed form can be dropped through the Parish Office door, given to any Parish Councillor or returned directly to Martin, who will arrange for them to be hand delivered on your behalf.

Martin is a valuable asset to the village and we need to try to do everything we can to protect this service for residents.

Rural Hedge Cutting

The Parish Council will be arranging the hedge cutting service again this year and it is hoped that this will commence at the beginning of November. If you wish to have your name added to the list, please contact the Clerk. Please note that you will still need to add your name to the list, even if you have used the service in the past.

Martin Sherwood our Community Warden

The KCC public consultation is now running for residents from 12 July to 3 October. We have the opportunity to put forward their views on the future of the community warden scheme. Martin Sherwood has been a great asset within our parishes of Harrietsham and Lenham and he has been vital in gaining much needed support for many residents and organisations. Martin's work has been outstanding. That support has included assistance in delivery of medication to vulnerable residents during the pandemic, and positive practical support to residents during this cost of living crisis. If you wish to write a letter we will be happy to collect and upload them to the consultation. We also have small booklet consultations that can be written in and we are happy to deliver them to residents and collect if necessary. Residents can also email concerns and comments to us to pass on, as the online form does not allow emails. Below is from the KCC consultation document

As set out in the 2023/24 budget, to help meet the financial challenge KCC is facing, the Community Warden service has been asked to reduce its annual budget by £1 million by 2024/25. Setting this year's budget was the most challenging it has ever been, due to increasing demands on KCC services and the cost of providing them.

To achieve this level of saving it has been proposed that the service is redesigned, ensuring that there is core Community Warden presence across the county, with teams covering two district authority areas. This would retain the community-based way the service currently works but use data and information to identify need and where best to place wardens so they can have the most impact.

Bearsted Choral Society

'I was glad' - Music and Anthems for Coronations



King Charles III and Queen Camilla's coronation had been over for several months by the time that Bearsted Choral Society's Summer Concert was due to be performed. However, our conductor and musical director, Andrew Lowen, was of the opinion that this gave us greater freedom to perform music from all coronations since that of George II in 1727, up to and including that of our new King and Queen.

'Zadok the Priest' was written for the moment when George II was anointed and has appeared at every coronation since. We saw this year how the long, carefully timed introduction covered the erection of screens around the throne and that the music then describes to the congregation events which are hidden from sight. The grandeur of another Handel composition 'The Hallelujah Chorus' would seem to have been a top choice for any coronation, and yet Queen Victoria is the only monarch to have used it.

The coronation of King Edward VII was postponed by 6 weeks because the 60-year-old King needed an operation for appendicitis. This was the occasion of the first performance of Parry's anthem 'I was glad' sung as a processional at the start of the service. Again, we saw on 6 May 2023 the careful timing of this anthem so that the King passed the Westminster scholars as they sang the latin 'Vivats' and then as he processed past the choir we heard the more intimate section 'O pray for the peace of Jerusalem', with the King eventually reaching the throne at the final climax

The concert included other traditional marches and anthems such as Elgar's 'Pomp and Circumstance No 4', but, also, more gentle pieces such as Elgar's 'O hearken thou' and S S Wesley's anthem 'Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace', which was chosen to cover the act of homage by the Princes and Peers of the realm by George VI and Elizabeth II. At Elizabeth II's coronation in 1953 an invitation was extended to Healey Willan, a Canadian composer of great distinction, to compose an anthem as the representative of Commonwealth musicians. His anthem 'O Lord our Governour' was also performed at the homage of the Peers.

The most modern piece of music to be included in our programme was Andrew Lloyd Webber's 'Make a joyful noise' commissioned for the coronation of King Charles III, which provided a contrast to some of the more demanding anthems and music in the 2023 service. Our concert closed with rousing audience participation in the Vaughan Williams setting of 'The Old Hundredth' and finally, of course 'The National Anthem'.

The members of Bearsted Choral Society had enjoyed learning and performing such uplifting and contrasting pieces of music and we would like to thank our accompanist Trevor Brearley and conductor Andrew Lowen, who also performed solo pieces on the organ and on the piano. We would also like to thank St John the Baptist Church in Harrietsham for hosting our concert in their magnificent church.

Bearsted Choral Society will be singing Choral Evensong in Rochester Cathedral on Saturday 14 October and everyone is welcome to join in the worship. Our next concert will be a 'Family Christmas Concert' on Saturday 16 December, which promises to be an interesting departure from our traditional choral offerings.

Bras, make sure they are fit for purpose!

It is brilliant to see so many people running around our villages and the groups helping new runners are making so much progress.

As a runner I have always been very concerned with the phrase, "you just need a pair of decent trainers to be able to run". For women this is not true... a good well fitting supportive bra is hugely important. The connective tissues, Coopers ligaments are irreparable and damage to these cannot be reversed. They need protecting. I see so many women running with bras that are non supportive and cannot be comfortable and must give pain maybe during and certainly afterwards.

In the past I have researched bras for running, football and Zumba found that bras that fasten at the front are much more effective. I now only use one model that almost completely restricts movement. Running is definitely high impact! Please take a bit of time to look into what type of bra is best for you. You will feel better and your running will definitely improve!

Remember a short run is better than no run! Good luck!

THE JPK (Sussex) Project Throws Doors Open to New Residential Centre.

- The centre is to provide assisted living for eight adults alongside the training centre at Old Town Café on Church Street in Eastbourne.
- The Project began life as a tea party in the back garden to support parents of children with learning disabilities.

These are the headlines of the press release, but the story behind them is so much more. On July 14th Gow Lodge was officially opened by His Majesty's Lord Lieutenant of East Sussex, Andrew Blackman. Also in attendance were the Mayor of Eastbourne, Candy Vaughan, as well as a large crowd of supporters and some of the trainees and residents along with their families.

I was there also! along with my whole family and I like to think that my Mum had an eye on the proceedings as well! I definitely was well aware that I was also representing all the many people in Kent who have supported me over the years in my endeavours to aid my sister Jill Parker M.B.E.

Jill, whom many of you will have met at my Ploughmans and Pimms events, has devoted her life to fighting to make the voice of the learning disabled heard after realising in the 1980s that her daughter Katie, now aged 44 would need additional support throughout her life.

Gow Lodge is on the site of the former Edgemond Chapel on Church Street. It has eight en-suite rooms as well as a communal kitchen and living area, plus access to computers and laundry facilities. Some of the people who will live there may also gain catering and hospitality qualifications at the Old Town Café next door which opened in 2015. In 2017 Jill was awarded her M.B.E for services to people with learning disabilities and their carers. It all began with a tea party which raised a few hundred pounds but eventually reached the £ 3 million target they needed.

The charity struggled for a long time to find a site and to win support from local adult services, and has relied on on-going fundraising and volunteers to keep the JPK vision alive. Jill's and my Mum Sylvia even chained herself to railings on her 90th birthday in 2010 to protest against the refusal of East Sussex County Council to release derelict land which was being used as a tip, and which could have been used for the Project. But the long struggle has finally come to an end. I quote the words that Jill used in her welcoming speech:-

"We have fought for over 40 years to be a voice for people who cannot speak for themselves. Caring for children with disabilities is a full time job, but the worry of what would happen to our sons and daughters once we were too old to look after them drove us on. We are thrilled that our residential care home is finally open. It will give hope to all the families whose loved ones need extra care."

Many thanks to all of you who have given such amazing support to the Project.

The Madonna of the Woods

Recently the Len Valley Health Walks visited the 'Madonna 'or 'Lady of the Woods' having parked at the Bowl Inn returning later for refreshments.


There were two groups one chose a longer walk across footpaths and the other a shorter walk along Warren Street Road (from the Bowl towards Warren Street, Lenham). From there we turned right into an unmarked footpath for several hundred yards and at a clearing in the woods, there she was! A trunk of a dead oak tree about nine feet tall carved into the shape of a woman who appears to be pregnant. She is festooned by garlands of flowers and necklaces by visitors.

It is unknown who carved the 'Lady in the Woods.' As the carving style is thoroughly modern it was assumed that she might haven been carved by a German prisoner of war or one of the teachers at Bunce Court School. However, the lady looks so young and fresh that this seems very unlikely, and the more recent theory is that she was carved in the seventies. Whoever carved the sculpture, knew that torching the wood would give her not only more texture but also make her last longer.

Standing in front of her is quite a moving experience. She is such a graceful figure, and you think that she must have been made, seemingly for 'free', by a very special person who took the time and trouble to carve her for us to enjoy the surprising encounter.

Christian Message

This year we have had 3 more grandchildren added to our family – there are now 8 little ones amongst us. This is pure delight.

For me, to hold a newborn child is massively humbling as we wonder at the incredulity of their arrival, their very existence; wonder at who they shall become and give thanks for the life in which we share, the continuity of humankind to which they allude. Sometimes we describe these really little ones as 'bundles of joy', and when they are newly wrapped, freshly swaddled in breathable blankets, light as a feather, they are exactly that – joy!

The Native American Indian tribes held a precious, travelling gift in their midst – they called it their 'Sacred Bundle'. The sacred bundle was a piece of hide, animal skin, that swaddled ancient and meaningful objects to the tribe. The hide was held secure by thongs of leather and the objects only revealed at particular times of festivity, of ritual, specific life events and occasions of deep concern for the tribe. The contents of the Sacred Bundle informed them of their past history, their culture, their purpose and their vision. Hidden and secure amongst the objects would be the tribe narrative and the elders would be the ones to hold that story like holding a compass – so that in times of disorientation or distress they could know their true direction because of these past reminders. In times of festivity and celebration they could direct their gratitude appropriately and joyously towards their backstory and their deeply ingrained identity that would lead them forward. The Sacred Bundles went wherever they went: their identity, origins, hopes and beliefs all wrapped, tied up together in one visual and symbolic collective.

What if each of us is a Sacred Bundle ourselves?

Tied up and held as we are with our past, our histories, our kinship, our experiences – born, as I believe we are, with hope and purpose firmly planted within our being. Hope that waxes and wanes at varying times in our lives we know, we experience that, but hope that somehow or other never entirely fades. Even in the most distressing or bewildering times, we still hope, if only we hope for change. Or we hope for freedom from pain or tumult. Glimmers of hope exist even when a human soul descends to the depths – hope is holding and forming around them, even then.

Life's richness is made known in the shared experience of joys and highs, sorrows and delights – life's sacred, holy aspects brought to birth among us as we live out our life's call.

Jesus words I have come that you shall have life and have it in abundance or in fullness alludes not to some heavenly impossible perfection but to the rich experience of being human and the sacredness of all life. Those stories we gather along the way.
