It is on top of the Downs near Lenham. A two acre garden with a wide range of trees and shrubs, herbaceous materials and woodland plants.

On the 1 August we had a trip out to The National Fruit collection at Brogdale. There are over 4000 varieties of apples, pears, cherries, plums and other fruiting trees. The site is now owned by The East Malling Research Station so its future is secured for the time being. The trees are used for research by many organisations. After our tour we enjoyed a cream tea.

Our next meeting is in the Village Hall at 7.30pm on 17 September and features a talk by Dilogen de Alwis entitled 'In praise of weeds'.

We would like to expand our membership so why not come along to our next meeting to see what we are all about. You don' have to join immediately but do join us if you like what you see. Even if you don't have a garden there are other topics covered such as house plants and window boxes and hanging baskets.. We also like to arrange visits to gardens and other venues.

Whilst I'm writing this we're experiencing a heat wave so it seems odd to report on the inclement weather of the past surrounded by fans and drinking ice cold water. As many readers will know the past Harrietsham economy was mainly built around agriculture. In days gone past September was seen as the harvest month the village which would have been awash with heavy labour and carts taking locally grown wheat, barley and hops to local market towns. Up until the early 20th century there was a bustling cottage economy in growing hops throughout the village much as the same throughout the whole of Kent. However in September 1816 things were a little bit different, inclement weather severely impacted the local hop harvest. Indeed history has noted 1816 as the "Year of No Summer" described as "biblical" freezing temperatures during the summer months. Several weeks of blusterous winds, cold nights and "unkindly whether" had resulted in stunted growth and poor quality.

"The few that do appear [hops] a very mouldy, and vermin a very prevalent. In short there is every reason to believe that the growth will be the shortest known in the county for many years".

The miserable weather of September 1816 reached it's high point on Wednesday the 11th of September. Harrietsham was hit by heavy ice storms including hail as big as "cobnuts", Many houses were damaged, windows smashed and crops left wasted. The resulting harvest meant a shortage of locally brewed beer lets hope the same cannot be said in 2024!

They failed to obtain from the judge their claim for a Cost Protection Order. Sadly, without that protection, it is impossible to continue their challenge through a judicial review process.

We would like to state our admiration for the personal sacrifice made by the group and in particular Steve Heeley and Kate Hammond. We will continue to work with them in all other ways we can. The fight will continue.

At a Transportation board meeting in July, we continued to support the efforts of Kent County Councillor Shellina Prendergast to promote concerns we all have regarding speeding traffic and highway safety on the A20. Like her, we have urged a collaborative approach to limits from Charing through Lenham, Harrietsham and Hollingbourne through to Bearsted. By continuing to work with Parish Councils, all the input will, we hope, make the A20 safer.

In July we welcomed Kim White who gave a really interesting and amusing talk about her career as a "Woman in Policing". Born and brought up in





She spent 30 years in the service and ended up with an OBE for her work. What a fantastic career!
